Everything you wanted to know about the Covid-19 Vaccines

Currently in the United States, there are 2 widely available Vaccines. One made by pharmaceutical company Moderna and the other made by Pfizer. They are very similar but have some basic differences.

Important things to know about the Covid-19 Vaccine

- Like all vaccines, COVID-19 mRNA vaccines have been rigorously tested for safety before being authorized for use in the United States.
- mRNA technology is new, but not unknown. They have been studied for more than a decade.
- mRNA vaccines do not contain a live virus and do not carry a risk of causing disease in the vaccinated person.
- mRNA from the vaccine never enters the nucleus of the cell and does not affect or interact with a person's DNA.
